#### **Tour overview**

Leaving Alice we take the well traveled tourist run to Hermannsburg, the home of the famous Australian artist Albert Namatijira, and learn about his life and the Lutheran churches involvement in this area. We continue for Kings canyon on the not so traveled Mereenie loop, where we will walk the rim of this spectacular rock formation. Hoping we travel in a good season we will see fields of wildflowers as we make our way to Curtin Springs, Yalara, Uluru and Kata Tjuta where there is always something different to learn and see.

After a few walks and stories we leave this area for the desert country of the Finke river and Simpson desert. For the 400 km crossing and 1200 sand dunes of the Simpson desert. Another area that has so much to offer, after back to back raisin the desert, it will leave you in ore of its beauty.

Arriving in Birdsville with a well earned thirst we will visit its famous hotel. Before making our way across to the inland rivers and basins of outback Queensland, to finish our tour in Toowoomba.

#### Day 1 Alice Springs - Kings canyon

We will collect you from your accommodation at 7 am. Today we are traveling out of Alice Springs towards Hermannsburg (most famous as the birthplace of Albert Namatjira), a remote Aboriginal community and Lutheran mission. We will travel the Mereenie Loop road and walk the rim of the Goose Bluff meteorite, and then on to our camp in the Watarrka National Park. (Kings Canyon)

#### Day 2 Kings canyon

Today we are going to walk the 6 km rim walk of the Kings Canyon. This is a grade 4 walk with spectacular views of the canyon and surrounding area. Then we will return to our camp for a meal under the stars.

#### Day 3 Kings canyon - Uluru

Pack up camp and drive to, for some, the long awaited first sighting of Uluru, one of Australia's most famous landmarks and the second biggest monolith in the world. We will visit the cultural center and hope to get a taste of this amazing connection to the land and the local Yulara Aboriginal people.

## Day 4 Uluru

This morning we will get up Early for a sunrise over the Rock, then walk the Rim. We do not recommend anyone to climb this impressive structure but would hope we would walk the circumference of this wonderful Rock. (10.6KM walk) **B.L.D.T.S.C** 

## Day 5 Uluru - Kata Tjuta

Today we will see the western side of the national park and walk the Kata Tjuta land formation. We will be in the area all day so hope that we all walk the Valley of the Winds (7.4km). Return to Yalara for a sunset over the Rock. We will spend another night at Uluru National Park

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#### Day 6 Uluru - Mt Dare station

After packing camp we will be following the Finke river out into the Simpson Desert to make our camp on the edge of this desert at Mt Dare Station. Here you will be pleasantly surprised by where we are camped.

#### Day 7 Mt Dare - Simpson Desert

An early start today with some spectacular sand dunes to cross and a few hundred kms of desert to travers. Visit Dalhousie springs for a swim in the artesian waters. Our night will be spent in one of Australia's remote places, the Simpson Desert, you can only imagine the star show.

## What to bring

Even though our days will be perfect weather the nights can drop in temperature, and it is very unlikely that we will experience rain.

Keep your luggage to a minimum

Torch with spare batteries (Head torches are perfect)Warm jacket, Pillow, sleeping bag or sheet and good blanket, Good walking shoes with ankle support, Thongs or sandals, Brimmed straw hat is best. 3 sets of casual clothes, 1 set of smart casuals, Toiletries, Swimmers and towel, Backpack and water bottle, Binoculars / cameraTropical strength repellent, Sun screen, Phone service will be available in certain areas so you can stay in touch with the outside world.

## What will be available for your use

A solar powered refrigerator will be available for any medicine. In-car chargers can be used for charging appliances and also opportunities for 240 volt charging.

We will provide pegs and line for hanging clothes and buckets to wash in Bush shower, toilet paper, hand sanitiser and fresh drinking water, Esky for keeping drinks and alcohol cold, Cutlery, crockery and glassware

First aid kitMaps and reference books Satellite phone for emergency use.

Please remember that we are traveling through a beautiful remote part of Australia, as safety is our first thought, this is an adventure you will never forget.

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
